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Message from the Executive

The end of another year is rapidly approaching and I think it's fair to say that this has been a mixed year for the fortunes of the Society. We've seen several key changes within the Executive and this left us somewhat unprepared to move forward as we had hoped we would in 2009. 2010 is just around the corner and we really to get ready now to be in a good position for the New Year.

We have as a Society come in for some criticism for lack of growth and lack of direction, for being just a social group for older members. There is some truth in these assertions but change is not the sole responsibility of the Executive and all members need to take a part if we are to continue into the future.

We have made a start and recently revisited our purpose, which I've quoted below for reference.

The Society was founded in Halifax, Nova Scotia, in 1786, as a social and charitable institution for the purpose of honouring the patron saint of England, St George, celebrating English culture and traditions and to assist Englishmen in distress in Halifax.

Today we still hold to these ideals and continue to strive to build a Society that reflects these aims and the Canadian culture within which we live. It is our hope to gradually increase our membership by offering a range of social and fundraising activities that will appeal to the broad age range of our membership.

We wanted to see if this still held meaning for us and found that it did and that we are in fact still holding true to this purpose. We acknowledge that we do not fundraise in a way that is largely visible and would like to see our performance on this front improve. However, fundraising is not the main focus of the Society at this time.

To change the focus of the Society requires an active Executive. Our AGM will be held in January 2010 and our nominating committee is seeking new members for the Executive to help make the changes required. If you want to see change within the Society you need to be stepping forward now and making it known that you wish to be considered for a position on the committee.







If you are interested in taking up a post on the Executive, please complete the self nomination form attached to the newsletter and send it to Ange Phillips at the address given. It should be noted that all positions are to be considered vacant, except that of Past President, so please feel free to apply for any position for which you feel you have the skills.

The nominating committee will then propose a slate of members at the AGM in January for voting on. Your support is vital to keep The Royal St George's Society of Halifax alive.

Some planning cannot wait for a new Executive to be formed however, so we have gone ahead and booked our Annual St George's Day dinner at the Windows Restaurant in the World Trade and Convention Centre. The evening is planned to be a traditional dinner with reception drink at 6.30 and seating for dinner at 7.00 - black tie is optional.

A brief reminder that membership fees are also due soon, these remain very reasonable at \$30 for a single membership and \$50 for couples.

I look forward to meeting up with many of you at the Christmas Brunch on Sunday 6th December at midday. We will be accepting donations for Christmas Daddies and items for the seafarers Christmas shoe box campaign during brunch. I hope you will feel able to contribute to one or other of these worthy causes. I've included a little about each for information.
